

Debbie May to lead the Offsite Assignment Board

The Laboratory is regularly called upon by government organizations to provide subject matter experts for temporary offsite assignments. To coordinate these strategic deployments, the Director's Office created the LLNL Offsite Assignment Board (OAB) several years ago.

Debbie May, deputy Z Program manager in the Global Security Directorate, has been selected to succeed Bob Vince as leader of the OAB. Her focus in this role will be to enhance the impact of these assignments for both partner organizations and employees by managing strategic staff deployment and ensuring smooth employee transitions into and out of the Laboratory.

Offsite assignments play a critical role in the ability of the Laboratory to serve the nation, and they present opportunities for growth for employees. In some cases, Laboratory employees serve as temporary members of the federal service through an intergovernmental personnel agreement (IPAs). In other cases, their Laboratory status is maintained while they serve in change-of-station assignments. Some positions last two or more years and some just a few months, depending on sponsor need and employee interest.
